Regional level work important, but Council needs to retain provincewide focus; regional tables should not precede government to government/reconciliation discussions Focus Council work through the Working Groups (WG) **ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS** Tara will send out a summary of regional species and habitat priorities when ready. 4. Staff priorities **DISCUSSION** Tara shared PPT on Council roles and staff priorities Next step is work planning for WGs. Policy development Evaluate performance Develop options Make decision **DISCUSSION** 5. Work planning MWAC will meet every second month (6 x per year) Working Groups should meet monthly or as needed Five Working Groups (leads): Funding (Jasper and Doug Janz); Research (Adam); Objectives and Stewardship (Mike); Governance and Reconciliation (Andrea and Cailyn); Foundations (Shaun and Rick, group inactive until needed)

- Staff and consultant to work with each WG to develop a workplan (template to be provided), and notify Maryam of anticipated need for staff/consultant support (ASAP)
- Judith to add WG reports and a report by Tara on implementation as a standing item on Council agendas
- Staff to develop a template for Council briefing notes/decisions

6. BC-First Nations Forum presentation

PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION

- Forum co-chairs Hunter Lampreau and Lisa Helmer provided an overview of the development of the Forum and its workplan
- Building trust and relationships are foundational to a new way of doing business with First Nations
- Creating project (Limited Entry Hunt Cultural and Educational project) piloting ability to provide LEH applicants with First Nations history and culture as guests to the area
- Shared decision-making working group and Indigenous Knowledge (action 18 and 23) –
 Forum to come back to Council for further input
- Reporting of standardized harvest data desirable, but sensitive. It is important to
 respect self-governance and individual Nations' approach. Environmental Stewardship
 Initiative (ESI, 4 groups) and Collaborative Stewardship Forum (CSF, 5 groups) working
 on regional approaches.

ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS

- Forum Terms of Reference (ToR) have been added to Teams; staff will share MWAC
 ToR with Forum
- Co-chairs to ensure regular check-ins between Forum and Council; need to figure out reporting relationships
