3. Implementation: High level budget

 Tara Szkorupa presented information on a proposed high-level budget and allocations for FY 2021-22 (spending of \$10M uplift to implement Together for Wildlife). Other sources of funding for wildlife, habitat and reconciliation work were identified, including core budgets, COVID stimulus funds, Land Based Investment Strategy, other ministries, etc.

DISCUSSION

- Council requested additional detail for each of the funding 'pots.'
- Regions are currently submitting funding priorities. First Nations involvement is varied, need to look at how to make this a more partnership approach and best mechanisms to ensure access to funding.
- Ideas and questions related to setting aside a percentage of funds for Conservation Land acquisition, data management, predator management, reconciliation, and support for the First Nation Forum.
- Council should consider performance measures to clearly set out ("tell the story") what the \$10 M uplift has accomplished; perhaps a role for Foundations WG to provide guidance on this and Director's Report.

ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS

• At the next meeting, Tara Szkorupa will report on regional priorities and provide additional details on the budget categories.

3. Implementation: HCTF

- Nancy Wilkin talked to Habitat Conservation Trust Foundation (HCTF) about being more inclusive on allocation approaches, and ways to better include First Nations. They are open to this discussion.
- The Province is proposing to transfer about \$1.3 M from 2020-21 T4W funds to HCTF to support future wildlife and habitat stewardship work in BC. HCTF will continue discussions with MWAC to ensure priorities are considered for allocating these funds.

DISCUSSION

- The Council supported a one-time transfer of Together for Wildlife Funds to HCTF.
- Recognition of concerns regarding HCTF allocation processes. HCTF needs to better address broader issues, improve partnership approaches, and be less technical project based; good opportunity to make this process work better.

ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS

- Council or Funding WG to meet with HCTF to discuss allocation process and Council priorities.
- Province to transfer \$1.3 M from 2020-21 T4W funds to HCTF to support future projects.

3. Implementation: website updates

 Maryam Mofidpoor provided an update on website progress. Content is being developed during March, and design will occur in April. An MWAC logo/branding could occur at a later date.

4. Stewardship Objectives WG Workplan
