2.	Approval of meeting minutes (January 9, 2022)	 DECISIONS Minutes from the January 2022 MWAC meeting #13: no changes. Moved by Shaun Hollingsworth, seconded by Cailyn Glasser to approve meeting minutes. Approved. Action items from last meeting completed as shown in minutes. 			
3.	Regional Wildlife Committees	 Action items from last meeting completed as shown in minutes. PRESENTATION Andrea Barnett and Cailyn Glasser presented their proposed approach to further developing this concept, including planning and hosting a workshop session that would lead to a recommendation to the Minister in the fall. While this work is closely related to the shared decision making work of the Forum, it has been separated for now to reduce complexity. DISCUSSION Council members were very supportive of the proposed approach. Ideas for consideration included: Participation at the workshop (just Forum/PHTAT/Council or broader?) Importance of including regional staff, and asking them to talk beforehand to existing regional bodies for input. Also need to recognize workload and challenges of reorganization for staff. Sign off of draft recommendations by FN Forum/PHTAT/Council before being presented as a recommendation to the Minister. Adding membership to the workshop discussion topics. Preparing communications materials that can be used by Council and staff for engagement in regions.

3.	Updates	 Tara Szkorupa provided updates from the HCTF. HCTF has set up a special account for their T4W funding to ensure that funds are primarily allocated to Indigenous-led projects and support enhancing First Nation capacity to apply for funding. HCTF is looking at creating a new Indigenous Advisory position, and providing cultural training for staff and Board. Mike Demarchi noted concerns raised about the lack of profile for wildlife in the Ministry reorganization. A draft statement for inclusion in the next letter to the Minister is on Teams for Council to comment on. Doug Janz noted that the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change has released a discussion paper (Watershed-Security-Strategy-Discussion-Paper_04.pdf (gov.bc.ca) with the goal of "working together in partnership with Indigenous peoples to develop the Watershed Security Strategy and Fund". Council supported the recommendation to request a presentation on the program to the next Council meeting. Tara Szkorupa to ask for a presentation on the Watershed Security Strategy and Fund at the next Council meeting.

	Discussion with Garry Merkel	 Garry Merkel is a co-author of the Old Growth Strategy report: A New Future for Old Forests. He shared his experiences and approaches to creating the paradigm shift from "timber first" to ecosystem integrity. It means "thinking like an ecosystem" and finding a solution together.
