	Shared Decision Making Policy	<ul> <li>PRESENTATION</li> <li>Morris Prosser (Wildlife Policy Analyst, Engagement and Shared Decision-Making, LWRS) provided an overview of the First Nations – B.C. Wildlife and Habitat Conservation Forum (Forum) work to draft a Shared Decision Making Policy. This supports Goal 5 Action 18 of T4W. (PPT on Teams).</li> <li>A copy of the draft policy had been circulated to Council members for their review.</li> <li>This work focuses on non-statutory decisions, such as setting objectives. It lays the path to true co-management.</li> <li>The creation of Ethical Space is essential to this work, as a pathway of interaction between Indigenous and Western systems.</li> <li>The draft policy establishes Indigenous Knowledge as co-equal to science, both providing different lines of evidence.</li> <li>DISCUSSION</li> <li>It would be helpful to have examples of the scope of the policy, how it might be used.</li> <li>The role of Regional Wildlife Advisory Committees should be specifically included.</li> <li>MWAC could play a role in raising this policy with the Ministers.</li> <li>This policy could be further reviewed, together with work on Ethical Space, at the</li> </ul>

		<ul> <li>Need to ensure RWACs can play a meaningful role in decisions, but starting point is to build trust and relationships.</li> </ul>		
		<ul> <li>Mariana Nagy-Reis is preparing a policy analysis paper showing areas of agreement / differing opinions; where there should be provincial level strategy and where there should be regional flexibility. This will also include a template for terms of reference. Staff will also be engaging with First Nations and stakeholders in regions.</li> </ul>		
		<ul> <li>Facilitators for the RWACs need to be well-versed in ethical space. Selection of facilitators should be a shared process (Province/First Nations).</li> </ul>
