3. Regional	Andrea Barnett, Cailyn Glasser and Lisa Tedesco provided an overview of the updated Regional Wildlife Advisory Committee (RWAC) policy paper, based on input from the joint September meeting and Objectives Working Group discussions.

	DISCUSSION					

Representative vs non-representative participation: important that selection be perceived
as fair and inclusive. Members need to be accountable to principles and wildlife above the
needs of their organization.

Scope:

- Should include ability to direct funds locally—request that this be moved back in scope.
- Statutory decision making is out of scope

• There is need for:

- Guidance on when a region is "ready" to establish an RWAC; there will be a need to balance desires of groups who are anxious to move ahead with First Nations who may need additional time and capacity. Timelines will vary by region.
- Guidance on interim approaches where RWACs are not being immediately established.
- Public education to ensure people understand that shared decision-making is an act of reconciliation.
- Clarity around who the RWACs report to in regions (FOR, LWRS or both?)
- A (future) operational procedures document could address items such as defining consensus.
- There will be considerable flexibility for regions to determine definition of region, size of committees, etc.
- It was noted that Kootenay-Boundary and Thompson-Okanagan regions are working with a contract team (Fraser Basin Council) to explore options for establishing RWACs, including engaging with First Nations and stakeholders.
- Council members confirmed their support for moving RWACs forward as quickly as possible, while continuing to address outstanding items.

ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS

- Policy options paper to be forwarded to the Ministers, together with MWAC recommendation to include education, timeline/capacity, enabling funding decision making role, and clarity around reporting structure.
- Andrea Barnett to draft a paragraph to include in next letter to Minister addressing MWAC's recommendations regarding RWACs.

4. T4W Updates

PRESENTATION

- Lisa Tedesco provided updates on T4W staffing. Work is proceeding on filling vacancies.
- A T4W "dashboard" is now live, providing an "at-a-glance" look at projects and expenditures. This will be linked from the both the T4W and MWAC websites.
- Updates on the various actions are available in the <u>presentation</u>.

 Morris Prosser provided an update on the Ethical Space and Non-statutory Decisionmaking Policy. Ethical Space will be developed as a guidance document, and the policy is being drafted. Once the draft guidance and policy have been endorsed by the Forum, these documents will be shared with MWAC (likely Spring 2023).

ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS

- Gavin Newall to add the dashboard link to the MWAC website.
- Morris Prosser to bring the Ethical Space Guidance and draft Shared Decision-making Policy to MWAC when ready.

5. Governance of Funding

PRESENTATION

- Hasan Kettaneh provided an overview of his work with Jasper Lament to <u>compare</u> <u>financial governance models</u>. This included Coast Funds, HCTF, the New Zealand Waikato River Authority and the Conservation Federation of Missouri.
- <u>Characteristics of good funding models</u> include: inclusive governance (co-governance/co-management); sustainable finance; non-for-profit (arms length from government); cross-functional committee structure; blended fund; forever fund; permanent funding; outcome-based; responsible investing (ESG); impact investing; and transparency & public accountability.

DICSUSSION

- Members discussed some of the pros and cons of the models presented, and the need for permanent funding sources in addition to possible funding through the federal Nature Agreement.
- A preferred model would blend the best characteristics of these models.

ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS

- Hasan Kettaneh and Jasper Lament will further refine funding model review, and prepare a recommendation to include in the letter to the Ministers (together with the Funding Principles).
- 6. Legislation updates
- Dennis Paradine provided an update on legislation. Members discussed how MWAC (and Forum) should be involved in the review and development of an intentions paper.
- The Indigenous Knowledge and Sheltering policies have been released for formal consultation with First Nations.

ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS

• Dennis Paradine to share the Indigenous Knowledge and Sheltering policies, as well as summary of outcomes from the September joint workshop.

7. Biodiversity Declaration

PRESENTATION

- Céline Davis provided <u>a presentation</u> on the proposed Biodiversity Declaration.
 - The Old Growth Strategic Review (OGSR) recommendation to "prioritize ecosystem health" will align with other provincial actions including T4W.

- This integrated approach includes shared desired outcomes of: healthy
 ecosystems; reconciliation with Indigenous peoples; climate change resiliency;
 sustainable economies; and biodiversity (including wildlife and species at risk).
- The Biodiversity Declaration will be a powerful catalyst for a shift in thinking and creates a vision and the conditions for change. It will be co-developed with Indigenous Governments (now to Spring 2023), with targeted engagement to follow.

DISCUSSION

- This is part of the paradigm shift MWAC is championing.
- Implementation of the OGSR and Biodiversity Declaration will require updates to legislation, but staff are also looking at "quick wins" such as updating species lists under the Forest and Range Practices Act and Oil and Gas Activities Act.
- Ethical Space will be used in developing the Declaration, and for legislative changes required.
- The Declaration applies to all ecosystem types. This provides an opportunity to promote restoration activities such as cultural burning of grasslands.
- There is potential for backlash from economic interests. Clear messaging will be needed to demonstrate that economic growth is dependent on healthy ecosystems, and that benefits go far beyond just "big trees" or species protection. Early engagement with industry will be critical. Needs clear messaging around what is broken/needs fixing, that this needs to be taken seriously.
- A draft document will be shared with MWAC early next year for feedback.

ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS

- Karyn Stefanyk and Sarah Jean Dixon to follow up with Morris Prosser on inclusion of Ethical Space.
- Céline Davis to share the draft document with MWAC when ready.

8. Wildlife Dialogues

- Two Wildlife Dialogues are planned (December 2nd, 9–11 am with Indigenous; December 6th 6–8 pm with stakeholders).
- Members discussed the key questions and determined that discussion should focus on input to development of RWACs, especially topics still under discussion.

ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS

- Morris Prosser and Cheryl Rentz-Bennett to confirm the key questions with the Forum Secretariat.
- Judith Cullington to prepare and send out invitations to the Dialogues.
- Judith Cullington and Lisa Tedesco to prepare some pre-reading materials for Dialogues participants.
- Lisa Tedesco to invite regional BC staff to participate in the Dialogues.

9. Council Priorities

PRESENTATION

 Kari Stuart-Smith and Mike Demarchi presented their analysis of highest priorities for MWAC, based on discussions with the Objectives Working Group.

DISCUSSION

Through discussion, MWAC determined that highest priority actions for 2022-2024 would be:

- Advising Ministry work on:
 - o Wildlife Act review
 - RWAC implementation and monitoring (through the RWAC Working Group, leads Mike Demarchi, Kari Stuart-Smith, Andrea Barnett, Cailyn Glasser)
 - Engagement on Objective Setting Policy
- Leading work on:
 - Models for governance of funding and dedicated funding (through the Funding Task Force, lead Jasper Lament with support from Hasan Kettaneh)
 - A Science Advisory and Research model (through the Research Working Group, lead Adam Ford)
 - MWAC communications and outreach (lead Megan Hanacek working with staff/consultants)
 - Wildlife corridors and crossings (pending input from response to recommendation 18 to Ministers).
- There is a need for a broader highly integrated discussion on how wildlife is managed in B.C., and how to better integrate Indigenous ways of thinking. This could be linked to the Biodiversity Declaration work and include discussions with all of Caucus, not just the FOR and LWRS Ministers.
- Council will continue to push for responses and action on the recommendations already submitted, and to provide input to other initiatives (such as the shared decision-making policy).

ACTIONS/NEXT STEPS

- Judith Cullington and Nancy Wilkin will coordinate the development of a November letter
 to the Ministers, seeking follow up on existing recommendations; providing new
 recommendations on implementation of RWACs, governance of funding, and a broader
 vision for wildlife management in B.C.; and advising on MWAC priorities for the next two
 years.
- Judith Cullington to ask all Council members which working groups/task forces they would like to be part of.
